Are you one of Illinois' estimated 720,000 hearing impaired people or do you know someone that is? Hearing loss is probably the single most chronic disability in the United States, affecting nearly four times as many as blindness.

To help protect hearing, the Elk Grove Lions Club will sponsor a free hearing screening from 9am to 4pm on Monday, June 23 in the parking lot of the Pavilion Fitness Center. Everyone is urged to take advantage of this screening. There is no charge. Anyone under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult. No pre-registration is required. You do not need to be an Elk Grove Village resident or a member of the Lions.
