At the most recent Village Board meeting, Mayor Craig Johnson issued a proclamation naming October 8 as “Lions Candy Day”.

Whereas, The Lions Club was founded in 1917 by Melvin Jones. His goal was to create an organization of businesses who

shared a common goal of bettering the community; and

Whereas, Lions Club International is a network of 1.3 million men and women in 202 countries and geographic areas who work together to answer the needs that challenge communities around the world; and

Whereas, that network of men and women conduct vision and health screenings, build parks, support eye hospitals, award scholarships, assist youth, provide supplies to victims of natural disasters; and

Whereas, the Lions Club of Illinois has raised an unprecedented amount of money for those who are visually and hearing impaired over the years through events such as Candy Day and

Whereas, Candy Day allows the Illinois citizens to contribute to an organization that will in turn, give back to the public. The candy they receive is a token of appreciation from the Lions Club for their donation; and

Whereas, all proceeds made from Candy Day will go to the programs the Lions Club of Illinois promotes to continue to help the visually and hearing impaired. **Now, therefore**, I Craig B. Johnson, Mayor of the Village of Elk Grove Village, do hereby proclaim October 8, 2010 as “**Lions Candy Day**” in Illinois, and applaud the Lions Club for nobly serving the public for over 100 years.

Document Destruction & Electronic Recycling Day, October 9, in Elk Grove

On Saturday, October 9 from 9-11am, in the Elk Grove Village Municipal Complex parking lot. Documents such as bank statements, medical forms, credit card applications, personal files or records, retired tax form, or receipts and samples of items that should be shredded before discarding. Staples and paper clips do not need to be removed, but binders are not allowed. Business waste will not be accepted. A proof of residency is required.

Also on Saturday, October, Motorola and SWANCC will hold a free computer/electronics recycling event. Residents within a SWANCC member community may drop off unwanted computer materials at 1301 E. Algonquin Road between 9am and 3pm. Enter Gate A. Examples of acceptable items include: computers, printers, keyboards, monitors, office equipment, telephones, calculators, visual equipment.
